Teaching Opportunities for Faculty

The Pre-Clerkship comprises the first 15 months of the 3-year UGME program and is divided into 5 units called Medical Foundations plus 7 weeks of elective time in July and August. Our students learn through problem-based learning, in small tutorial groups of 6-8 students.

During Pre-Clerkship, there are several roles available to faculty members who are interested in teaching medical students. Some of the positions include: Tutors, Clinical Skills Preceptors, Specialized Clinical Skills Preceptors, Pro-Comp Longitudinal Facilitators, Student Advisors, OSCE Examiners, Admissions Volunteers, Curriculum Contributors, Large Group Session Speakers, Curriculum Planners, and more.

Pre-Clerkship OSCE

The Class of 2024 completed their second Objective Structured Clinical Exam (OSCE), the Pre-Clerkship OSCE.

The OSCE is an annual method of assessing medical student's competencies, and a perfect example of the program's style of problem-based learning. The simulated clinical experience has both clinical evaluators and patient actors.

Students across our entire distributed medical education network completed 7 stations with a different scenario written on the door of each room. They read the scenario posted on the door before proceeding with the examination. They have 9 minutes per scenario room and 3 minutes for feedback. The scenario may require students to conduct a history, do a physical examination, or counsel a "patient".

NRC Class of 2025 & Advisor Dinner


