Examining the Efficacy of ChatGPT in Marking Short-Answer Assessments



In a recent study by Leo Morjaria (C25), Levi Burns (C24), Keyna Bracken (Pre-Clerkship Chair), Anthony Levinson (Division of e-Learning Innovation and MedPortal Director), Quang Ngo (Student Assessment Chair), Mark Lee (Research Support Manager, MERIT), and Matthew Sibbald (Associate Dean, UGME), explore ChatGPT's effectiveness in evaluating short-answer assessments in the undergraduate medical program. Facing challenges in timeliness and scalability, traditional methods benefit from the integration of artificial intelligence. The study reveals promising results, with ChatGPT showing commendable correlations with human assessors, particularly when no rubric was present. This research establishes ChatGPT as a viable assistant to human assessment, laying the foundation for future endeavors in AI-based techniques. The collaborative efforts of the research team underscore exciting possibilities at the intersection of AI and education. You can read the full article <u>here</u>.
